

Summary of issues raised on review of the 2014-19 East Devon AONB Management Strategy

The table below provides a summary of the key issues raised to date by the East Devon AONB Partnership and key stakeholders in response to internal consultations on the draft document and how we have responded to this feedback.

Comments	Action
Rename: In line with other examples, it was felt the new plan should be called a 'Partnership Plan' to reflect the nature of its delivery through partnership initiatives and action	Plan renamed 'Partnership Plan'
Light touch: Partnership, in particular the local authorities, requested a light touch approach given the timing of the review and the political uncertainty surrounding Brexit and future delivery for designated landscapes	A light touch review has been taken. The main policies remain unchanged as there has been no cause or concern to date to suggest altering these. Other elements have been updated including key policy influences and forces for change
Simplify the format: The review provides the opportunity to create a more business-like plan with a succinct and clear format that is easier to read.	<p>The plan has been revised with the key themes renamed to Place/People and Prosperity /Communication and Management each assigned Strategic aims.</p> <p>The vision, strategic aims and key objectives have been added at the start of the plan.</p> <p>Much of the referencing to policies and text relating to the plan process and background has been articulated in supporting documentation provided by National Association for AONBs. This will be available as supporting documentation to the plan.</p>
Delivery Plan: It was suggested that an annual delivery plan (rather than 5yr) should be developed given the political uncertainty	The delivery plan will be agreed following public consultation and will be based on the approved priority actions
